- support mechanisms for strategic experimentation of new approaches
- nimble and authentic ways of working with our communities to imagine and transition to living differently

Part One:

Designing our future and disrupting our status quos

This will involve a series of engaging capability building workshop sessions creating an immersive multi-format experience.

- Introducing ideas and tools to support our collective ability to tackle disruption, innovation and transformation for Aotearoa
- Trans-disciplinary forums to explore the systemwide insights, opportunities for integration and shifts required
- Active sessions to experiment with new ideas and approaches

Part Two: Taking it to the streets

In the late afternoon and into the evening we will host a public event where the communities of Te Whanganui- a-Tara can engage directly with a series of dynamic activities and installations. These will be designed to provoke thinking, ideas and conversations around issues that are crucial to creating a healthy future in Aotearoa and trial innovative ways to approach engaging with our communities.

The forum participants will be actively involved in that event alongside installation collaborators.
